Who we are:

The Global Renewables Alliance (GRA) was established at COP27, as an umbrella organisation of six other well-known renewable energy associations, the Global Wind Energy Council, the Global Solar Council, the International Hydropower Association, the Green Hydrogen Organisation, the Long Duration Energy Storage Council, and the International Geothermal Association. Together, we advocate for a unified voice to accelerate the global energy transition.

At COP28 in Dubai, GRA played a pivotal role in securing the commitment to triple global renewable energy capacity by 2030, marking the largest private sector renewable energy intervention to date. Our mission is to champion a future powered by clean, secure, and just energy—renewables.

To date, the GRA has been active in promoting renewable energy growth at multilateral levels, including high-profile events such as New York Climate Week, the Clean Energy Ministerial, and COPs. We are now expanding our efforts to support the implementation of the tripling goal at the national level, with a particular focus on Latin America and the Asia Pacific regions. We collaborate closely with governments, industry leaders, investors, NGOs, multilateral organisations and corporations to accelerate the energy transition at the necessary speed and scale.

Role Overview:

The Regional Lead for Asia Pacific will lead GRA's strategic and political engagement across the region, with a primary focus on Indonesia. This role is instrumental in advancing the implementation of the global goal to triple renewable energy by 2030, agreed at COP28. The Lead will work to help shift political dynamics in the region to accelerate renewable energy deployment, engage with key stakeholders, and leverage regional leadership to drive progress with neighbouring countries.

Key Responsibilities:

1. Strategic engagement in Indonesia:

- Develop and execute a strategy to enhance Indonesia's renewable energy ambitions, aligning with the tripling goal and at least meeting its 75GW goal to 2030.
- Engage with federal and state governments, policymakers, and regulatory bodies to advocate for supportive policies and frameworks.
- Collaborate with national renewable energy associations, private sector stakeholders, and civil society organisations to foster a cohesive approach to renewable energy deployment.
- Work closely with GRA's member organisation leads in the region to ensure alignment and synergy in national initiatives.

2. Regional and international collaboration:

- Monitor and track progress in the region and identify opportunities for engagement.
- Identify and leverage leadership from countries with advanced renewable energy sectors to influence neighbouring nations.

- Facilitate knowledge sharing and best practices among Asia Pacific countries to promote regional collaboration.
- Support engagement with international and multilateral organisations to align efforts and help mobilise resources for renewable energy projects where viable.
- Support efforts to influence COP31 leadership and outcomes on renewable energy (assuming this is led by Australia), and delivery of GRA's COP31 strategy. Engage and maintain relationships with the COP31 presidency.

4. Stakeholder relationship management:

- Build and maintain robust relationships with key stakeholders, including government agencies, industry leaders and civil society organisations.
- Leverage existing networks to identify opportunities for collaboration and influence policy development.
- Represent GRA at key forums, workshops and conferences that support the growth of renewables.

Qualifications:

- Minimum of 8 years of experience in the renewable energy or energy sector, with a strong understanding of the political landscape in Asia Pacific.
- Proven track record of strategic leadership and successful stakeholder engagement.
- Strong understanding of political campaigns and advocacy.
- Extensive network within the renewable energy sector and related civil society groups across Indonesia (and wider Asia Pacific is desirable).
- Ability to work collaboratively with diverse stakeholders, including governments, private sector and civil society organisations.
- Strategic thinker with the ability to identify and leverage opportunities for advancing renewable energy objectives.
- Strong communication and advocacy skills.
- Native English language equivalent. Indonesian and other Asian languages a plus
